TRAVELING EXHIBIT DETAILS

Exhibit includes:

38 framed photographs

Exhibit text panel

Descriptive placards for each photograph

Exhibit size requirements:

Approximately 1,500 ft² of secure, climate-controlled exhibit space

Adequate storage for shipping crates

Appropriate museum-quality lighting required

Insurance:

Hosting institution will be required to provide a certificate of insurance before exhibit ships

Fees:

In addition to the rental fee, host institution is responsible for paying prorated shipping cost (one direction of shipping) and travel costs for one GRAMMY Museum staff member for installation and de-installation
